

Confidence given a boost



MATURE-aged job seeker Vivian Doyle helped overcome low self-esteem.

AS A mature-aged indigenous job seeker, Vivian Doyle was forced to fight her low self-esteem and rise to new challenges.

Sarina Russo Job Access national indigenous co-ordinator Shane Barnes said Ms Doyle arrived at SRJA unsure of her abilities and certain that no one would employ her.

Mr Barnes said that, having been mentored and put forward for a training course, Ms Doyle became a traineeship verification clerk at the Department of Justice and Attorney General.

Following the completion of her

traineeship, Ms Doyle gained permanent employment with the Brisbane Magistrates Court which, she said, was very exciting.

She said a confidence boost from SRJA, as well as a few pushes in the right direction had assisted her in her quest for employment.

Positive feedback and constant encouragement motivated Ms Doyle all the way through to her court position where she is “doing just fine”.

Ms Doyle is to attend the Indigenous Jobs Market in Brisbane’s King George Square on Friday, August 3.
